Anti-bullying Week / Safeguarding

This year's focus for Anti-Bullying Week was the **POWER of GOOD** which focusses on making the right choices if you witness someone being bullied; it is about having the confidence to **speak out** and know where to get the right support. As always, we have had a huge focus on cyberbullying, at the appropriate level, for each year group to ensure the children are aware and fully understand the consequences of using social media sites. Have a look at our website for some of the work the children have been doing. In line with helping pupils to stay safe online, we'd like to ensure you are aware that the minimum age to open an account on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik, and Snapchat is **13**. For Vine, Tinder and Yik Yak it's **17**. YouTube requires account holders to be 18, but a **13-year-old** can sign up with a parent's permission. It is essential that you are aware of what your

Safeguarding is given a highest priority at Ash Croft. There may be times when adults are concerned about children in the community. Please don't ignore concerns; child protection is everyone's responsibility. If you have a concern, please speak to your Inclusion Managers Mrs Haddon or Mrs Twigg.

PE Kits Outdoor

All classes continue with outdoor PE throughout the year so make sure tracksuit/jogging bottoms, trainers and sweatshirts are in school for correct days. Please ensure that your child has their kit in school at all times and make sure PE t-shirts are white round necked NOT polo shirts. Do remember to send them back washed on the first day after the holidays.



Winter and Asthma

You may find your child's asthma gets worse in colder weather. Make sure they always carry their inhaler with them out of school. Please also make sure your child has an inhaler in school - inhalers save lives!

All inhalers and medication must be prescribed by a doctor. You will need to complete a consent form when bringing in medication to school. The school cannot administer medication bought over the counter. Speak to the office staff if you have any questions.

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Awards/Achievements

We would like to celebrate your child's achievements outside school as well as within. Please let your child's class teacher know of any achievements and awards.

Focus on Reading

One of our main school targets this year is to improve the standard of reading across the school. Your children read, and are read to, regularly in class and we ask that you read with them as often as possible at home. Do remember that this is not just about sharing a book, it could be reading a shopping list, a takeaway menu or instructions on a game. Every time you sign your child's reading record, they have a chance of winning a book in assembly each week.



Being ready to learn

Over the last couple of weeks, I have been observing teaching and learning across the school. Unfortunately, there are a significant number of children who are not ready to learn at the start of the school day. Some children are very tired and it is affected their ability to learn effectively. Please could you encourage your children to go to bed reasonably early? Thank you.
